

Plastic & Paper Recycling at WALSER'S

We accept a wide variety of commercial and consumer materials for recycling at no charge. This includes plastics of nearly all kinds and papers and boards of all kinds. This can potentially save businesses and residents trash expenses and at the same time gives the assurance that the materials will be recycled properly and not into our landfills. This expanded recycle collection, beyond our e-waste and metal services, has four categories:

Plastics – We accept nearly any and all plastics as long as there is no contact with hazardous liquids or materials currently or previously and they are reasonably clean. This includes acceptance of shrink films, plastic bags, hard and soft plastics, plastic containers, plastic pallets, vinyl, bubble wrap, etc. The materials must be virtually free of contamination with non-plastic materials such as paper, wood and metal. Minor amounts of tape is acceptable. We do not currently accept Styrofoam, packing foam or peanuts for recycling. However, we will gladly accept clean packing peanuts for reuse in our store.

White Paper – This is basically uncoated white office paper as used for copying and printing. It may have minor amounts of staples, but no color to the stock at all. The printing may be in color or black, but not with excessive ink coverage. There cannot be any binding plastic or metal content. This category of paper must be clean and not coated (glossy or matte). Shredded white paper is acceptable, but may not contain any papers other than white paper. Many manuals and books might fit into this category with their covers removed.

Mixed Paper – This category is very open and allows for all other papers including: shredded mixed paper, art papers, blueprints, junk mail, color papers, coated papers and almost any fibrous paper stock. Again, the paper must be clean and may not be contaminated with any plastic, metal, paint, etc.

OCC Cardboard – This includes: corrugated cardboard, chip board, illustration boards, kraft paper, paper towel rolls, etc.

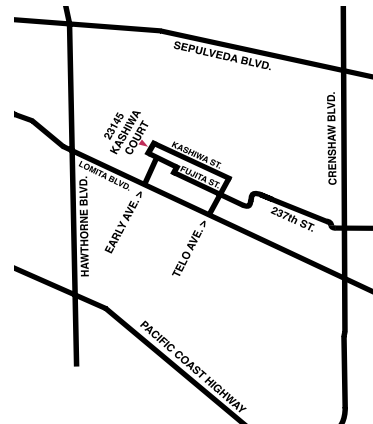

Turn Your Electronic & Metal Waste into Reusable Materials with Our Recycle Collection

As a community service and to demonstrate our continuing dedication to waste reduction and recycling, WALSER'S began accepting E-waste, "white box" waste and scrap metal for recycle collection in 2006. Our 22,000 square foot facility is an authorized E-Waste collector for the State of California and the only full time designated agent for the City of Torrance. We accept materials from residents, businesses and government agencies six days a week. All dismantling and disposal is compliant with state guidelines for safe handling of hazardous materials as well as secure destruction of any electronic data.

Small items and small loads can be dropped off anytime during the recycle hours listed. Large items and large loads should be called in first to assure access and minimize your wait time.

Drop-Off Area: All recycle items should be brought to our loading dock ramp near the rear of our building. Please drive down the ramp and ring the red door bell for assistance. No dumping is permitted.

Acceptable Free Drop-Off Items: computer monitors (CRT's); televisions; console televisions; projection TV's; projectors; computers (CPU's); laptops; keyboards; computer mice; scanners; fax machines; black & white and color copiers; printers; multiuse machines (fax, scan and print); speakers; external disk and hard drives; circuit boards and other loose parts; crushed or destroyed hard drives and other electronics; network hubs, modems and routers; other electronic peripherals; cords and cables; PDA's and PDA cradles; cellular

phones; telephone systems; telecommunications equipment; radios and stereos; electronic toys and "Gameboys"; video games and consoles; VCR's; DVD players; camcorders and digital cameras; older large mainframes; adding machines and calculators; electronic pen plotters; electronic scales; electronic credit card machines and printers; toner cartridges; CD disks; DVD disks; digital tapes; batteries within electronics; UPS's (Uninterrupted Power Sources); large electrical and electronic equipment; microwave



ovens; vacuum cleaners; blenders and mixers; coffee makers; bread makers; cameras; X-ray film & photo film; electric lawn mowers; electric motors; electric fans; electric shavers; electrical appliances; electric power tools; electrical power panels and control boxes; flashlights (unless battery acid damaged); washers; dryers; dishwashers; refrigerators; air conditioners; general scrap metal (including steel, cast iron, aluminum, brass and copper); non-hazardous objects with a large percentage of metal, such as metal lawn furniture, bed frames, bicycles etc.

Acceptable Drop-Off Items that Incur Hazardous Material Handling Fees: fluorescent tubes; CFL's; incandescent light bulbs; loose, dry cell batteries and UPS batteries. These items may be taken to hazardous waste handling locations, often for no charge.



Unacceptable Items: X-ray equipment and materials; broken glass of any kind including CRT's, lamps, etc.; smoke detectors; thermostats; wet cell batteries and automotive batteries; leaking batteries; lamp fixtures with breakable glass or ceramic; biohazardous materials; any items hazardous to handle or with breakable glass or ceramic.

NO AUDIO TAPES, VIDEO TAPES OR COMPUTER MEDIA - We are experiencing restrictions in recycling Audio & Video Tapes and Computer Media (disks, tapes and floppies). Due to adverse economic conditions concerning recycling the above materials, we are temporarily not accepting them until we can resume processing them for zero or minimal charges. Unfortunately, all materials we recycle are undergoing detrimental market constraints that are resulting in substantial increases in handling and processing costs. Please save these items for future recycling. CD's and DVD's are still welcome for recycling as well as the holders (paper and plastic) and insert materials for all tapes and media, if separated.

Pick Up Service Available: Local, curb side or loading area pick up within the City of Torrance only is available for a nominal fee. We do not move items within the premises.
